### **STEM Room news**

The room is finally about to happen. During the first week of the holidays the school will be completely shut down while asbestos is removed from the site. Please do not allow your children to come and play at the school during this time. The builders envisage this process to take between 4 to 6 days.

As part of the STEM rebuild the canteen will be demolished and moved to a different location within the same area. This will of course cause a disruption to the food we can supply during the remainder of the year. Please ensure you carefully read the attached modified menu and support this process by preparing your lunch order ahead of time. The canteen manager will no longer have the location and the time to support the writing of school lunch bags. Class teachers will be more than happy to support you in this process. ### **NO NUTS**

On Monday night, Governing Council members moved and passed a motion to make Long Street Primary School a No Nuts school. This means that certain food products will be banned from school to ensure the safety of all students and staff. A detailed policy explaining what is acceptable and what is banned will be sent home in the near future. This policy has been introduced to support a high number of children and staff who have extreme life threatening allergies to nuts.

### **Breakfast Club**

The last day for Breakfast Club will be Wednesday next week (12<sup>th</sup> April) due to the canteen being refurbished for the STEM upgrade. Breakfast Club will not reopen for the remainder of 2017 but will once again reopen in 2018.

### **Head lice**

There has been an unfortunate rise in the cases of head lice being reported to class teachers and the school. Please spend the time looking through your child's hair and if necessary, treating their hair. Treatments are available from the chemist or the supermarket. We have also had several near misses with children riding their scooters down the middle of the road.
