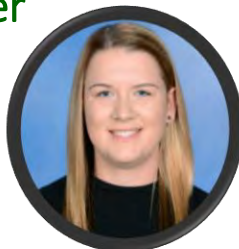
I wish you all a lovely Easter break, which will be here before we know it!

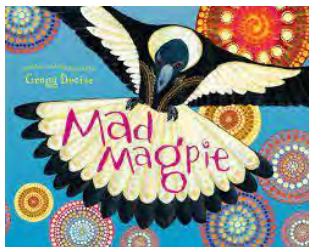
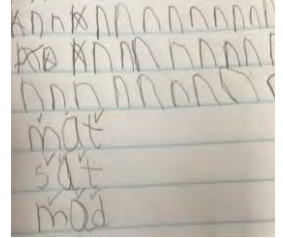
From our classes

Room 2 – Miss Knapton

Read Write Inc occurs each day from 9:35am – 10:20am for our students in Reception – Year 2. Miss Knapton takes the 'Sound Group' in Room 2. At home, you may have heard of Fred the Frog. Fred is a frog who only talks in sounds! When we practice reading and writing words, we 'Fred Talk' (sound out). During Read Write Inc each day the students in Miss Knapton's Sound Group are learning to:

- Recognise the sounds letters make
- Write letters correctly using the RWI formation phrases which were sent home
- Orally blend. For example, if you say the sounds h-a-t, students blend these together to say the word 'hat'
- Use letter magnets to build words containing the sounds they have learnt
- Use Fred Talk to read and write words containing the sounds they have learnt

It has been exciting to watch students develop their confidence learning sounds and begin to read and write words containing the sounds they have learnt.



Room 13 – Mrs Utting

During our English lessons this term we have been looking at the story book 'Mad Magpie' by Gregg Dreise. The story talks about Guluu the Magpie who gets very angry because the butcher birds tease him, he listens to the advice of the Elders and remembers how he use to sing when he was having a bad day.

During our investigation of the book, we first explored the language used to develop characters focusing on nouns and noun groups. Then we considered how characters develop through events using verbs and verb groups. Finally, we looked at literal and implied meanings. This means we discovered what information we could gain from the text and what we could deduce by reading between the lines.

Based on the advice the Elders gave to Guluu, Room 13 students were encouraged to write their own *words of wisdom* for others who may be having challenges with friendships. The students needed to incorporate a simile into their advice much like the Elders did in the story for Guluu.

There was a lot of robust conversation about some of the advice, as students explained their thinking and justified their choice of simile. Some of the advice from Room 13 includes *stay calm like a tiger in a tree*, *stay strong like an oak tree*, *stay calm like a fish in the water*, *stay strong like a shark in the deep*, *stay calm like the Elders*.

We decided that it might be helpful to others to share our messages and made a display to go in the window. We hoped that other students could refer to it when they were finding their social interactions challenging during play times.
