## Late Pass Process Update

To maximise learning time, we have updated the late pass process:

- Students who arrive between 8:50 and 9:00am will go straight to their classroom. The teacher will welcome them in and mark them as late on the roll.

## From our Deputy Principal

### Semester 1 Reports

Teachers have been busy preparing student reports for the end of the first semester. We have trialed a new format. This is intended to give greater detail to families regarding student achievement.

Changes you'll notice include:

- clearer student attribute criteria
- strengths / achievements and next learning goals for every learning area
- grades summary.

In line with research about best practice in reporting, the grades can be found as a summary on the back of the report. We know that the greatest impact on student achievement comes from knowing what students are doing well and where they need to go next through comments.

Here's the research findings by Dylan William:

Impact on:	Student Achievement	Student Attitude
Grades only	0% gain	Students with high grades: positive Students with low grades: negative
Comments only	30% gain	Students with positive comments: positive Students with constructive comments: positive
Grades and Comments	0% gain	Students with high grades: positive Students with low grades: negative

Why, you may wonder is there 0% gain for grades and comments? Because when there are grades, the comments become invisible. Whilst we are required to give grades and comments for Year 1-6 students, please prioritise celebrating and reflecting on pages 1-3, not the letter grades on the back cover.

Reports will be handed out on the last day of term. Any students who are unable to attend can collect their reports from the front office next term.

### Mathematics Professional Learning

All Long Street Primary School teachers attended a training on effective Maths teaching on Wednesday 21st June. The session, run by the Mathematics Association of South Australia (MASA), was about looking at the three dimensions of maths: unpacking the CAR model. CAR stands for:

- Concrete (real life/using hands-on materials)
- Abstract (numbers and symbols)
- Representational (image/visual)

This model works from early number (see picture below) through to highly complex mathematical problems.

Miss Hunt then spent extra time working with the MASA team investigating best practice teaching in Mathematics.

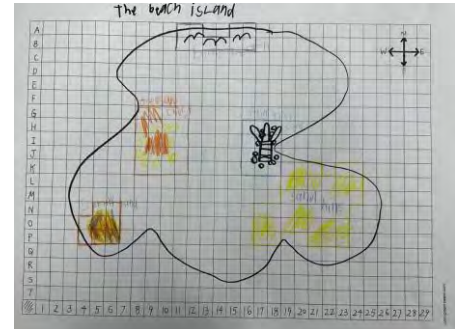
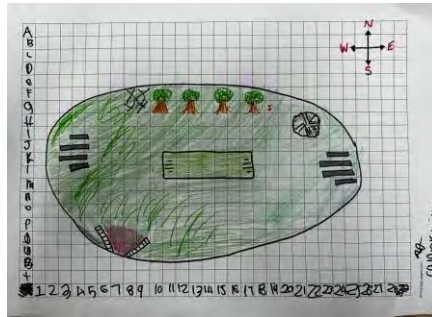


## From our classes

### Room 10 (Year 4/5)

In Mathematics this term, students have been learning about measurement. Firstly, students investigated the importance of measuring and why it is necessary to have scaled instruments to measure objects. After becoming familiar with the units of measurement for length, mass and capacity, students learned about perimeter and area.

Students were tasked with a mapping investigation to demonstrate their knowledge and understanding. They were instructed to create a map of either a place they were familiar with (the school or oval) or an imaginary place (an island or kingdom) to show their skills. Using the map, students demonstrated their ability to measure the perimeter and area of objects and other mapping skills, such as adding grid coordinates, a compass and giving directions.

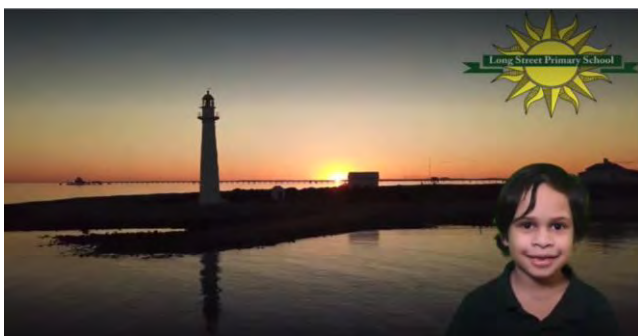


## Aboriginal Education

This year the AET role is focused on empowering our Aboriginal students as proud and confident learners, through and beyond schooling. Our goal is to give Aboriginal children and young people the opportunity to excel at school and create successful pathways. We are doing this through STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) learning which allows our Aboriginal students to make connections to their previous learning and their cultures.

Our Aboriginal students have been exploring and investigating shelters and how they were used. They have been researching different types of materials and how effective they would be in creating a safe space.

Students worked hard to help design and film an Acknowledgement of Country for our school. Some of our Year 6 students assisted in organising which parts would be read by each student and helping the younger students with their lines or confidence whilst filming. This allowed students to learn some new skills and explore the tech equipment and green screen we have in our media room.

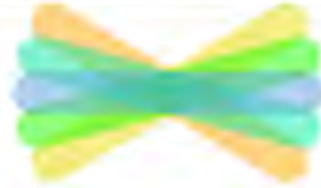
