Term 3 Pupil Free Day

On Thursday the 7th of September, we had a pupil free day to continue our mathematics journey from 2022. Lisa-Jane from Primary Maths Association joined us and lead us through understanding the best delivery mode for the Australian Curriculum to benefit the students. Staff were able to use some time to make plans for term 4 based on what learning is best covered daily, integrated withing other curriculum areas or taught as a series of lessons.

We spoke about the benefits of consistent mathematical language being used across the school and at home. To support the correct use of this language we will be sending home a conceptual language fridge display on digits, number, numerals, and number names for families. This can be a reference point for you at home to use the same language that we use at school.






